Program description

The major in French is based on the prior completion of 14 hours of proficiency-level preparation numbered <u>FR 1100-FR 1150</u> and <u>FR 2100-FR 2150</u>, or the equivalent. Equivalent preparation can be completed in high school, junior college or other colleges or universities, or waived through ACCP and AP credits, satisfactory CLEP scores, or a department placement test. <u>FR 2050 - Conversation and Composition II</u> (3) and <u>FR 2060 - Conversation and Composition II</u> (3), are also offered for practice in lower-level French.

The French major provides a base of knowledge in language, literature, culture, and film that can prepare you for exciting careers and open many doors. The sequence of courses will lead to a Senior Capstone project on a research topic that fascinates you, along with personalized mentoring for it. The major concentration in French consists of a minimum of 21 upper-division semester hours of coursework and a maximum of 42 credit hours. The low 21 credit hours requirement of the French major provides students with the possibility of combining it with another major such as Business, English, Nursing or Pre-med or a variety of minors to develop a broader and global perspective with minors such as areas as History, Journalism or Women, Gender & Sexuality Studies, among many other options. French courses can also be taken during the summer in our Faculty-Led Study Abroad Programs to Lyon, France. The mission of the French program is to cultivate appreciation and respect of other cultures, sensitivity to issues of social justice, the ability to communicate well with the people of those cultures in their language as well as to demonstrate the practical aspect of combining French for all professional endeavors.
